## Important information for students on Academic Probation

Your academic future is in jeopardy! Illinois State University is concerned about your future and is here to support you in your return to good academic standing through the Project Success program, which is required for all students on Academic Probation.

### Project Success will:

- Provide you with the detailed information you NEED to know about Academic Probation policies
- Link you with campus services such as tutoring, counseling, mentoring, study groups, and other available campus programs
- Offer you support and helpful tips about the “unspoken rules” of campus life, such as the best way to communicate with your professors and more

As stated, Project Success is required for all students on Academic Probation. Failure to complete the program will be considered by the Reinstatement Committee should you be dismissed from the University. Illinois State University believes that the knowledge of campus policies and the utilization of campus resources, combined with your hard work, are the key to achieving academic success. Project Success consists of several unique components that will be discussed at Success Seminar I. The following is a to-do list that will assist you in preparing for the Project Success program:

1. **Register for Success Seminar I** online by going to [UniversityCollege.IllinoisState.edu/projectsuccess](http://UniversityCollege.IllinoisState.edu/projectsuccess). Seminars should be scheduled as soon as possible, but **no later than August 25**. Seminars are only offered August 24 - September 8, so register today! 2. **Complete the Becoming a Successful College Student survey** at [UniversityCollege.IllinoisState.edu/projectsuccess/survey](http://UniversityCollege.IllinoisState.edu/projectsuccess/survey) before attending Success Seminar I.
3. **Attend Success Seminar I**, where you will:
  - Find out the requirements for Project Success
  - Learn about Academic Probation policies and how they affect you
  - Find out what you need to do to avoid dismissal from Illinois State
  - Learn detailed information about campus resources, and obtain contact information for those departments that may be able to assist you
  - Set goals that will improve your chances of academic success this semester
