

### □ 3. Transfer Credit or Dual Credit

If you have any transfer credit and/or dual credit, please contact the community college to send your transcripts to Illinois State. <u>Please know your high school does not send</u> your dual/transfer credit.

### □ 4. Advanced Placement/CLEP/IB Credit

Be sure to submit any Advanced Placement (AP) Exams, CLEP examination scores, or International Baccalaureate Organization Credit to Illinois State! Registrar.IllinoisState.edu/registration/exams

### **5.** ALEKS Placement
